Recommended Student Dress Code

The appearance of students enrolled in the School of Pharmacy and Health Professions (SPAHP) is expected to project a professional image for the School. The following recommendations are intended to promote a professional and productive learning environment for students in the classroom. A dress code for special events, laboratories, and clinical experiences may be established by the School, an individual program, or an individual instructor. Instructors/programs may request specific dress on specific occasions, so please abide by the dress code on said days. Overall, these are general guidelines to be conducive to learning.

If a student has any questions about certain aspects of the SPAHP Dress Code, they should contact the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs in the Office of Academic and Student Affairs.

General: In general, casual and appropriate clothing and shoes are recommended for didactic learning. Clothing should still be appropriate for everyone in the classroom setting.

Tops:

- Appropriate tops: t-shirts, polos, athletic shirts
- Not appropriate: tube tops, crop tops, or tops revealing body parts
- No t-shirts with offensive language or inappropriate logos

Pants/shorts:

- Appropriate: leggings, athletic shorts, joggers, khakis, jeans without/minimal holes
- Not appropriate: pajama pants or sweatpants

Shoes:

- Sneakers
- Boots
- Sandals

Business Casual

- Slacks, khakis, dresses or skirts that are of appropriate length
- Creighton polo, dress shirt, blouse
- Close-toed dress shoes, sandals when appropriate, etc.

Miscellaneous

- No hats during exams
- Fingernails should be short enough to do program specific duties
 Acrylic nails are not recommended

 - Nail polish is permitted
- Tattoos are permitted but must not be offensive
