A Note from the Chair

Dear Alumni.



We had a very busy spring and I have a lot of good news to share. Some changes in the School of Medicine including a new PA program and accelerated masters in Biological Science led to a 'hand-off' of the nursing anatomy and OT anatomy courses to EXS. This fall, we'll be teaching approximately 162 freshmen nursing students through 4 course offerings of EXS 111 Fundamentals of Human Anatomy (formerly BMS 111) and will provide instruction for OTD 339/340 next spring. We also added a new course, EXS 534 Neuromechanics of Human Movement, that is intended for our majors with a physics background, while those without a physics pre-reg will continue to take EXS 334 Biomechanics. The number of hours required for the internship has also changed. The course can now be repeated for up to 4 credits, but majors only need to complete 2 credit hours (100 hr) for graduation. The change has been well received and allows for more flexibility during the AY and improved accountability during the summer. With the addition of the new service courses, and multiple offerings of EXS 331 and EXS 320 to meet the UG demand across campus, we hired three new FT tenure-track faculty this year and one new adjunct to help with anatomy/physiology. Full bios for the new faculty will be included in our fall issue, but we're happy to be welcoming two of our own back to the department – Dr. Kelley Hammond (2008) and Dr. Leland Barker (2010). We were also fortunate to hire Dr. Mitch Magrini who recently received his PhD from Oklahoma State University. The other big news is a relocation of the department to the Criss Science Building in the next 12 – 15 months; I'll have more details in the fall, but it's a terrific opportunity for our department and we're all very excited at the prospect. Please enjoy this issue of the newsletter highlighting our amazing majors and faculty. Keep in touch.

Seventeen EXS students presented their research at the University's annual St. Albert's Day. Many of them also traveled to the ACSM Annual Meeting to present in June.





In academic year 2018-2019:

- *66 EXS majors graduated
- *51% graduated with honors
- *83% of those grads who applied to professional programs or graduate school were accepted and 56% of those chose to attend graduate school at Creighton!

Alpha Sigma Nu and Phi Beta Kappa

Alpha Sigma Nu $(A\Sigma N)$ is the Honor Society of Jesuit Colleges and Universities that recognizes students who distinguish themselves in scholarship, loyalty, and service through their academic, community, and professional pursuits. Only students ranking in the top 15% of their class are eligible for $A\Sigma N$ and no more than 4% of the junior and senior enrollment at Creighton can be nominated.
